Harrow has educated boys since 1243 but was officially founded by John Lyon under a Royal Charter of Elizabeth 1 in 1572. In 1608 the construction of the first school building began which was completed in 1615 and remains to this day. Harrow has 12 houses of 70 boys which will be expanded to 13 come September 2011.
